




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Tracking with Jesus



ALL ABOARD

EASY-TO-LEARN TRUTHS

At Rocky Railway, kids learn one important Bible Point each day. Instead of trying to teach kids more than they can remember or apply, Rocky Railway focuses on one key biblical concept. The Bible Point is reinforced daily through Bible adventures, key Bible verses, songs, snacks, and hands-on activities that help kids know more about God.

GOD SIGHTINGS

God hasn't retired, you know. He's as busy now as He's ever been. But until you see that with your own eyes, it's tough to have a vibrant faith. God can seem distant or impersonal. God is active in our everyday lives—and we can learn to look. We can make it a habit to keep an eye out for the daily overwhelming evidence that God is doing great things all around us.

At Rocky Railway, you'll encourage your crew to look for God Sightings—everyday clues that God is present, passionate, and powerful. A God Sighting is simply an acknowledgment that God has done something. It's giving God credit where credit is due. It's developing a God-focused view and a grateful heart. Kids will discover that they can see God in things like Scripture, people, circumstances, and nature.

On Monday, your child will learn about God Sightings during KidVid. In your kit you will find a silicon wristband for each child in your crew to have as a reminder to look for signs of God. Throughout the day, incorporate the Bible point into your activities and encourage the children to respond, "Trust Jesus!"

... LET THE GOOD TIMES ROLL!

Each day will begin with the All Aboard Opening Assembly at 9 am. After that, you have the freedom to set your own course and can do the activities at your own pace and in the order that works best for you. As the conductor, we hope you feel free to adjust the activities to best suit the age and size of your group. The goal is to have fun and keep your crew on track!

RECOMMENDED DAILY SCHEDULE:

PRAYER TIME: Daily Depot Devotionals for Conductors are provided for you to use before you "leave the station" each morning with your crew. Take some time to fill your tank and pray for the day ahead. Devotions are found on pages 19-25.

*ALL ABOARD OPENING ASSEMBLY: Our fun, action packed opening assembly begins each day at 9:00 am. Join us at WaysideChapel.org/vbs and click on the correct day button as we set out on the day's adventure.

*BIBLE ADVENTURES: While your passengers are all still fresh, set the tone for the day and introduce them to the day's Bible lesson.

*CRAFT DEPOT: All of the supplies you need for each day's craft are included in your Staycation Bible School Kit. Step-by-step instructions are included for each day in this Go-To Guide.

CHEW CHEW SNACKS: Explore the day's key Bible verse through a fun food experience and get to know each other better while you eat. Fun conversations starters can be found in the Railway Play: Fun Stuff to Choo with your Crew section found on pages 28-32.

*KIDVID CINEMA: Help the kids discover the Bible Point through watching true stories of children from around the world. This is a great time to discuss God Sightings!

LOCOMOTION GAMES: Allow the kids to wiggle and move as they explore the Bible Point in active ways. Games may need to be modified to adjust for size and age of your crew. Feel free to substitute an activity if you think it will work better.

*ROCKY'S WRAP-UP: You will close out each day back with Rocky and Spike as they review what they have learned each day with fun stories, jokes, music and more!

Dominic loves karate, even though it's hard. What is something in your life that you like to do, even though doing it can be hard?

How did Jesus help Dominic do the hard things we saw in the video?

Take out your Bible look up Philippians 4:13. Say the verse aloud together.

Watch the video with Axle Amy & All-Aboard Ashley where they discuss the KidVid video & questions, the key verse of the day, and God sightings!

Caboose:

Have your crew form a single file train by holding hands.

Designate one end of the train as the "engine" and the other end of the train as the "caboose".

All the other crew members make up the train cars.

The purpose of the game is to have the engine keep away from the caboose. If the caboose can catch the engine they have won. Mix up your train and play again.

Obstacle Course:

Use your swing set, trampoline, old tires, ropes, left over floor tiles, etc. to create a stellar obstacle course and then take turns "doing hard things."

A God Sighting is when we watch for God and then notice what God is doing all around us—all the time! God can be at work through things like nature or through someone else showing us love! To help remind you to Watch for God this week and even after VBS, we have included a wristband in your Staycation Bible School Kit!





Bible Adventures

Bible Point: Jesus' Power Gives Us Hope.

Bible Story: Paul encourages others in a storm and shipwreck. (Acts 27)

Bible Verse: "So be strong and courageous, all you who put your hope

in the LORD!" (Psalm 31:24)



Supplies:

Pine cone

Bird seed

Yarn

Shallow plate or bowl

Peanut butter, nut

butter, or vegetable

shortening

Spatula or butter knife

Cookie sheet

Craft Depot: Pine Cone Bird Feeder

Instructions:

Tie the piece of string to the top of the pine cone using the middle of the string, so that there are 2 pieces to tie around a branch.

Pour the birdseed into the shallow plate or bowl, set aside.

Use the butter knife or spatula to spread the peanut

butter, nut butter, or shortening all over the pine cone. Be sure to get it into all the cracks and crevices to fully coat your pine cone.

Roll the pine cone in the bird seed, covering as much of the pine cone

as possible.

Find the best place outside to hang it. Tie the string around a branch and enjoy watching the birds come to eat.

Ingredients:

Graham crackers Mini marshmallows

Chew Chew Snacks: Train Station S'mores

Instructions:

Break a graham cracker in half or in quarters.

Spread some chocolate on one of the graham cracker pieces.

Place mini marshmallows on top of the chocolate.

Top marshamallows with another graham cracker.


Repeat the process to make additional s'mores, if desired.

Substitutions:

Mini marshmallows substitute: regular sized marshmallows or marshmallow spread.

Chocolate substitutes: chocolate syrup, Nutella spread, melted chocolate candy bars, melted chocolate chips, or chocolate frosting.

LocoMotion Games

Storm Tag:

Designate one side of your play area as a "ship" and the opposite side as an "island". You can use a jump rope or a sheet if you want to create an enclosed area.

Place all of your crew into the "ship" and say, "The men who sailed with Paul had to swim to an island when their ship got stuck. Let's play a game where we try to get safely to that island."

The kids try to run from the ship to the island without getting sprayed by the leader (Use spray bottle, squirt gun, or hose). If they get wet they must return to the ship and start over.

Tossed in a Storm:

Have crew members spread out around a sheet.

Place five balls in the center of the sheet. Say, "We're going to pretend these balls are sailors on a ship in our storm. We're going to make wild waves with our sheet, but we want our "sailors" to stay safe on their ship!

Designate a child or two to be lifeguards. They can rescue any "sailors" who do fly off the parachute and return them to the "storm".

Craft Depot: Wood Slice Ornament

Supplies:

Wood slice

Twine

Sharpies, paints

Stickers

Instructions:

Decorate wood slices with whatever material you have available—sharpies, paint, stickers. Be creative with your designs—draw a picture, write "Trust Jesus", or any other designs that will remind you of VBS 2020.

Allow wood slice to dry before threading the twine through and tying a knot to create a loop for hanging.



Chew Chew Snacks: Railroad Crossing Wafers

Ingredients:

Sugar wafers (vanilla)

Frosting

Red M&Ms or other round

candy of similar size



Instructions:

Use a tiny dollop of frosting to connect two of the wafers together

to form a railroad crossing sign.

Add a small amount of frosting to the center of the top wafer.

Press one candy into the frosting.

Repeat the process to prepare more of these lip-smacking morsels.

Alternative snack:

Make a savory snack with a flavored cream cheese spread, peanut butter, or alternate spread to connect two pretzel rods together to form the sign. Add a dollop of your spread and a candy to finish off the snack.



LocoMotion Games

Bold Balloons:

Fill water balloons. Divide your crew into pairs.

Begin playing a game of toss with the balloons with the pairs standing close together.

After each successful toss take one step backwards.

Continue until the balloon is burst.

Measure the farthest distance that you were able to make the catch without bursting the balloon.



Spread out several pieces of luggage (suitcase, duffle, recycle bag, etc.) in your play area.

Place about 20 items in each piece of luggage.

Have each crew member choose a piece of luggage and stand near it. For the first round, each crew takes items from other crew member's bags, and runs them back to their own. Each person can only carry two items at a time.

Crew members cannot stop anyone from taking items from their bags, but they can work fast to take from other bags so their own bags don't get completely emptied.

The round ends when one crew member's bag is emptied. In round two, redistribute the items and play again, but this time the crew member's goal is to completely empty their bag.







Bible Adventures

Bible Point: Jesus' Power Lets Us Live Forever.

Bible Story: Jesus' death and resurrection. (Matthew 26:17—28:10)

Bible Verse: "The Spirit of God, who raised Jesus from the dead, lives in you."

(Romans 8:11)

Activity: Your kit came with a cross template and black dots that will be

used with the Bible lesson today.



Supplies:

Keychain craft kit Gospel colors card

Glue Scissors Paperclip

Tip:

If hole in bead is too small, use tip of paper clip to create bigger opening for black cord.

Craft Depot: Gospel Bead Keychain

Instructions:

Thread cross bead onto black cord. Slide across to the middle so that both ends of the cord are the same length. Tie 1 or 2 knots on each side of the cross to hold in place.

Use Gospel story card to thread beads through both ends of the cord in this order: blue, purple, yellow, black, red, white and green. Tie both cord ends around the metal key ring with a double knot.

Trim excess cord and add a drop of glue to secure knot.

Allow time for craft to dry and add the Gospel colors card.



Celebrate the Victory:

Divide your group in pairs.

Today we celebrate that Jesus' power lets us live forever! (Trust Jesus!) Have each pair create a cheer

that they will use to celebrate every time they accomplish their goal.

Place two buckets of water in the playing area on opposite sides.

You will need to put one sponge per pair in the bucket at the start line.

The goal is for the pairs to work together to get the sponge from one bucket to the other bucket without dropping it. The first person takes the sponge and moves towards the other bucket. After three steps they must throw it to the other person. The second person can be as close or as far away as they wish, but if they drop the sponge they have to go back to the original bucket. Then the second person can only take three steps and they must then throw to the first person.

Once they reach the other bucket they submerge the sponge again and do their cheer!

Repeat as time and interest allows.

God Sighting Walk:

Go for a walk in your neighborhood, backyard or local park and find five things that God created. Take along a small bag to collect items you find. When you get home, thank God for all He has created.



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



Three-legged race:

Child 1 stands while holding one end of the towel. Child 2 sits on the other end of the towel.


Child 1 pulls his friend as fast as he possibly can.

Leading a Child to Christ

Foundation:



Purple is for God. God is perfect, and holy, and good. He is also sovereign. Sovereign means that He is over all things. He is the King of kings. It is really amazing that the King of kings would care for us and want to have a relationship with us forever and ever.

(Deuteronomy 10:17)


Gospel:

Gold is for heaven. Heaven is God's eternal home. Heaven is very different from where we live. In heaven, there is no pain, suffering, sadness, or sickness. Everyone always has all that they need. The most wonderful thing about heaven is that God is there. God loves us very much and wants us to be with Him, but there is something that keeps us from being with God. (2 Chronicles 2:6; John 14:2; Revelation 21:4)

Dark represents sin. We sin when we do, say or think bad things. Telling a lie, hitting someone, or taking something that isn't ours are examples of sins. All of us have sinned. When we sin, it separates us from God and makes Him sad. This is because God is perfect. God always does what is right and loving and good. Because sin makes our hearts unclean we cannot be with God. God saw that we had a problem with sin and that we were unable to fix our sin problem on our own. But God showed His amazing love for us by giving us the help we need. (Romans 3:10; Romans 3:23; Romans 6:23)

Red represents the blood of Jesus — the only way our hearts can be made clean. God loves us so much that He sent His Son, Jesus, to earth. Jesus Christ (Hebrews 9:22) was a man who was different from any other person. Jesus is God and never sinned. Jesus came from heaven to earth to take the punishment for our sins. Instead of us being punished, He took our place. Jesus died on the cross so that all

DAILY DEPOT

For the Conductor—Day 1

Bible Point: JESUS' POWER HELPS US DO HARD THINGS.

Bible Story: Ananias helps Saul. (Acts 9:1-19)

Bible Verse: "For I can do everything through Christ, who gives me strength."

(Philippians 4:13)

Consider This ...

The Bible makes it evident that God often asks His followers to do hard things. Noah built an ark. Abraham prepared to sacrifice his son. Mary bore the Son of God. Ananias had the terrifying job of reaching out to Saul.

To understand the difficulty of Ananias' job, it's important to realize just how much Saul hated the early church. He approved the stoning of Stephen, arrested Christians in



Jerusalem, and set his sights on imprisoning Christians living in Damascus. Christians ran away from Saul—not toward him!

Ananias' name means "protected by the Lord." It's likely that his parents didn't know the importance of such protection during this important, history-altering mission.

In Acts 9:15, God doesn't ease Ananias' misgivings with words of comfort or empowerment. He simply shares his life-changing plan for Saul and urges Ananias to go.

Because of his selection and obedience, Ananias got to be the first person to welcome Saul as a Christian. In spite of any misgivings or fear, Ananias warmly greeted Saul with the phrase "Brother Saul."

Why It Matters ...

Jesus still asks his followers to do hard things. The kids at your VBS know it's hard to forgive when someone hurts their feelings. Some are dealing with difficult things at home. Kids can tell you how tough it is to make new friends, do what's unpopular, learn a new skill in school, and reach out in friendship to someone who's lonely. That's why today's activities will encourage kids with the truth that Jesus' power can fortify them through life's challenges. Just as Ananias drew strength from God's reassurances and plan, kids will come away with renewed inspiration that they can trust in Jesus' power to tackle the hard things they face.

DAILY DEPOT HITTEDEVOTIONAL HTTT

FOR THE CONDUCTOR—DAY 2

Bible Point: Jesus' Power Gives Us Hope.

Bible Story: Paul encourages others in a storm

and shipwreck. (Acts 27)

Bible Verse: "So be strong and courageous, all you

who put your hope in the LORD!"

(Psalm 31:24)



Consider This ...

After Paul became a follower of Jesus, he fervently shared the news of Jesus everywhere he went. In Jerusalem, Paul encountered a group of men who opposed his teachings. These men began a riot, accusing Paul of spreading false doctrine and of defiling the Temple. Guards arrested Paul and threw him in prison. The following years included trials, death threats, secret transfers to other prisons, and finally a trip to Rome where Paul could plead his case before Caesar.

In Acts 27:9, Paul notes the sailing season in connection with Jewish observances. Sailors typically only sailed from Pentecost (May-June) through Tabernacles (after the Day of Atonement in Late September or early October). Roman sailors resisted sailing in November, as it typically proved dangerous.

The sailors battled the fierce storm for at least three days, using every trick they knew to secure the ship and survive hurricane-force winds and waves. Finally, the weary seamen lost hope of ever being saved. At this low point, Paul shares the hopeful news given by God.

God's message of hope, conveyed through Paul, rang true for the soldiers, the sailors, and the prisoners. God's angel assured Paul that "none of you will lose your lives" (Acts 27:22). However, after the shipwreck, the soldiers planned to kill the prisoners so they wouldn't escape (Roman law mandated that a soldier who lost a prisoner had to take that prisoner's place!). "But the commanding officer wanted to spare Paul, so he didn't let them carry out their plan" (Acts 27:43). And, just as the angel said, not even a prisoner died.

Why It Matters ...

In many ways, Paul was powerless in the stormy sea. He didn't have experience as a sailor. Guards held him prisoner. And, of course, he couldn't stop the crashing waves and howling winds. But Paul did have Jesus' power on his side! In the same way, the kids at your VBS may feel powerless through life's storms. The world can seem turbulent, dark, and confusing. Bad news crashes over us. Fear blows relentlessly, leaving kids feeling hopeless. Yet God promises to strengthen us with His power! And we can trust that God's promises are true. Like Paul, we have Jesus' power on our side. Today, celebrate that truth and give kids the hope of victory and comfort during life's uncertainties.

DAILY DEPOT HITH DEVOTIONAL HITH For the Conductor—Day 3

Bible Point: Jesus' Power Helps Us Be Bold.

Bible Story: Peter and John teach about Jesus. (Acts 3:1—4:31)

Bible Verse: "He gives power to the weak and strength to the powerless."

(Isaiah 40:29)

Consider This . . .


In the name of Jesus, Peter and John healed a lame man at the Temple gate. The man celebrated the miracle so loudly that a crowd gathered. Peter, making the most of this instant audience, stood up and boldly shared the good news of Jesus.

The priests who heard Peter's message were most likely Sadducees. Sadducees didn't believe in the resurrection, nor did they believe in the existence of angels or spirits. These leaders also maintained loyalty to the Roman government and sought to maintain the status quo.

At the time, most Jews could read and write, but few—if any—received rabbinical training. Such an education would have made them skilled at lengthy theological discussions. So when Peter and John boldly preached before the Sanhedrin (a crowd of highly trained priests), the judges marveled at

their ability and noted that they must have been with Jesus.

After Peter and John's release from prison, the church gathered around them for prayer and praise. It's interesting to note that they don't pray for the persecution to stop, but that God would give them the boldness to continue sharing the news of Jesus in spite of their suffering.



Why It Matters . . .

Like Peter and John, most kids at your VBS are "untrained." Speaking out about their faith can be intimidating, especially in the face of a culture that often feels "anti-Christian." Many kids feel shy about praying before a restaurant meal, inviting a friend to church, or even mentioning Jesus in regular conversation. Other kids may feel unsure when it comes to showing Jesus' love, playing with a new friend, or reaching out to someone who's lonely. Today, give kids the chance to practice speaking about Jesus with ease and confidence. Provide opportunities for kids to daringly step out of their comfort zones. Bolster their bravery and cultivate a courageous faith, encouraging kids to rely on Jesus' power to help them be bold.

DAILY DEPOT HILL DEVOTIONAL HILL FOR THE CONDUCTOR—DAY 4

Bible Point: Jesus' Power Lets Us Live Forever.

Bible Story: Jesus' death and resurrection. (Matthew 26:17—28:10)

Bible Verse: "The Spirit of God, who raised Jesus from the dead, lives in you."

(Romans 8:11)

Consider This ...

The Passover meal shared between Jesus and His disciples commemorated God's miraculous provision for His people centuries earlier. In this traditional celebration, Jews remembered the sacrificial lamb whose blood (marked on their doorposts in Egypt) saved them. How appropriate that Jesus—our sacrificial lamb—completes His work on earth with such a symbolic event. In Jesus' culture—and in some Middle Eastern cultures today—eating together equaled friendship. Scholars equate sharing a meal with trust and intimacy, adding weight to Jesus' comment to Judas: "One of you who has just eaten from this bowl with me will betray me" (Matthew 26:23).



The Roman government had deprived the Sanhedrin of the right to carry out most capital punishments. Therefore, even though their chief priests and elders found Jesus guilty, they had to turn Him over to Pilate for execution.

At Jesus' death, Matthew 27:51 records that "the curtain in the sanctuary of the Temple was torn in two, from top to bottom," showing our sin that separated us from God was dealt with by Jesus' death on the cross. Even Jesus' followers found his resurrection hard to believe! Matthew 28:17 tells us, "but some of them doubted!" Yet Jesus removed their doubts by appearing to them repeatedly over 40 days (Acts 1:3; 10:40-41)

Why It Matters . . .

Death is an uncomfortable—and even scary—topic for children and adults. Even though we don't like to talk or think about it, it's likely that most kids will experience the death of a pet, friend, or relative. That's why it's critical that we help children understand the hope we have through Jesus. Even though death may mean the end of this life, kids can celebrate the astonishing promise of eternal life with Jesus. Use today's lesson to help children understand their need for Jesus. Guide them as they discover that through Jesus' miraculous power, we can live forever in heaven.

DAILY DEPOT HITT DEVOTIONAL HITT FOR THE CONDUCTOR—DAY 5

Bible Point: Jesus' Power Helps Us Be Good Friends.

Bible Story: The church is united. (Acts 2:42-47; 4:32-35)

Bible Verse: "Love each other in the same way I have Loved you."

(John 15:12)

Consider This ...

The book of Psalms mentions prayer more than 60 times—more than any other section of Scripture. The book of Acts comes in second, recording the importance and occurrence of prayer about 34 times. Clearly, the early church relied on prayer for hope, communion, healing, provision, and unity. Communication with God became a critical part of their community and a Christian's walk with God. Scholars believe that the early church probably met in Solomon's Colonnade, a porch along the inner side of the Temple wall, up on the Temple Mount

Many of the first Christians came from Jewish backgrounds, meaning they probably already followed God's command to give to the poor (Deuteronomy 15:4-8). Uniting and caring for others may have been a natural connection with their faith family.

Acts 4:33 records the great power with which the apostles testified about Jesus' resurrection. It's likely this refers to a boldness given by the Holy Spirit.




While Acts shines a light on the rapid growth of the early church (Acts 2:47; 4:4; 6:7; 9:31; 21:20), in a city of around 200,000 people, they still represented a minority of the population. This small band of believers needed to stick together and support each other!

Why It Matters . . .

Are the kids at your VBS like or unlike the early Christians? Why? Do they have a heart to serve, share, and bear one another's heartaches? What would happen if kids today had the same spirit of that first faith family? What would the church of tomorrow look like? You have the opportunity to send kids off with a passion for sharing Jesus' love in powerful and practical ways! With Jesus' power, we can transform tomorrow's faith community into an environment of belonging, sharing, caring, and community. Today, help kids discover how Jesus' power can help them be faithful friends who truly care for each other.



Green eggs or green ham? Grapes or crepes?


