

"His Return and Our Rewards"
Luke 19:11-27

1. The Parable of the 10 Minas shows what Christ said to His followers about living faithfully for Him. This parable was not just to the disciples, but for all of us who are followers of Jesus Christ. How does it help you to think of what you should be doing as you live your life?

2. Who does the man of noble birth represent in this parable?
Where does the nobleman go to receive his kingdom and where does he return to?

Before the king leaves, he calls 10 of his servants and gives them each a mina. What does the mina represent?

What were the servants to do with the mina (v.13)?

3. Another group, the citizens or the subjects, did not want him to be king.
Who did this group represent?

4. When the king returned, he called the servants in to find out what they had done with what he had entrusted to them. The first two servants used the money to be productive for the king and they were given a reward proportional to the amount of money earned. What did the servant in verse 20 do with his mina?

What's the man's reasoning behind this action (v.21)?

5. The man's words were used to judge him, because if this man was right, then he should have banked the money and the king would have at least received his money back with interest. Do you think this servant expected the king to come back? What about you?
6. If you believe that Jesus is coming back, as He said, what do you think you should be doing when it comes to the king's business? How are you going about Christ's work until His return?
