

PREPARE YOUR HEART & MIND

Begin this time in prayer, confessing any sins you can recall, thanking the Lord for the gift of His Word, and asking for His Spirit to guide you in your time.

11 See with what large letters I am writing to you with my own hand. 12 Those who desire to make a good showing in the flesh try to compel you to be circumcised, simply so that they will not be persecuted for the cross of Christ. 13 For those who are circumcised do not even keep the Law themselves, but they desire to have you circumcised so that they may boast in your flesh. 14 But may it never be that I would boast, except in the cross of our Lord Jesus Christ, through which the world has been crucified to me, and I to the world. 15 For neither is circumcision anything, nor uncircumcision, but a new creation. 16 And those who will walk by this rule, peace and mercy be upon them, and upon the Israel of God. 17 From now on let no one cause trouble for me, for I bear on my body the brand-marks of Jesus. 18 The grace of our Lord Jesus Christ be with your spirit, brethren. Amen.

GROW IN THE WORD

- O1. Paul emphasized that he wrote this section of his letter to the Galatians with his own hand. He criticized those who persuaded believers to be circumcised, reasoning that they only did so to avoid persecution for the cross. He reiterated that even they did not keep the Law themselves but only wanted to boast about their influence (v. 11-13).
 - Why do you think Paul highlighted that he wrote "with large letters" in his "own hand" in verse 11? What does that emphasize about his message?

GROW IN THE WORD

•	Based on these verses, how would you describe the motives of those insisting on circumcision for believers? See also Matthew 23:5-7; Romans 2:28-29.
•	What are some modern examples of people prioritizing external appearances or works over true faith in Christ? How can you avoid falling into this trap?
)2	Paul declared that his only boast was in Jesus, through whom he has died to the world. He reiterated that neither circumcision nor uncircumcision mattered, but becoming a new creation was most important. He concluded the letter with a blessing of peace and mercy for those who followed his instruction and reflected on his own sufferings for Jesus (v. 14-18).

• What did Paul mean when he wrote about being a "new creation", and why is it more important than external religious practices? Consider 2 Corinthians 5:17; Ephesians 4:20-24.
