# A SERMON SERIES IN PHILIPPIANS

### **Prepare Your Heart & Mind**

Begin this time in prayer, confessing any sins you can recall, thanking the Lord for the gift of His Word, and asking for His Spirit to quide you in your time.

• In what ways were you encouraged by last week's study?

### **Reflect/Connect**

• Use these questions for a time of individual reflection or to connect with others in meaningful conversation.

### Grow in the Word

• These questions are designed as a guide for individual study and to foster spiritual conversation with a group of people.

• What are some obstacles to unity among any group of people?

• On the other hand, what are some things that help a group of people unite?



### GROW IN THE WORD

Paul presented a conditional exhortation to the Philippians: if they had experienced any benefit from their relationship with Jesus, then Paul urged them to complete his joy by pursuing unity in mind, heart, and purpose (v. 1-2).

- What is the primary requirement for achieving the type of unity Paul called for in these verses? See also John 15:5-13.
- What are the benefits that Paul assumed to be present realities for the Philippians? Describe a time when you experienced one of the benefits Paul listed.

• What attitudes, thoughts, actions, or emotions might you hold on to that prevent you from greater unity with other believers?

The Philippians were commanded to center their behavior on the idea that others were at least as important as themselves. Paul called this attitude humility (v. 3-4).

• Why was this message so timely for the Philippians? See Philippians 1:15-17; 1:28-30; 4:2-3.

• What do you think our society considers more important: self-centeredness or selflessness? Compare your thoughts with the biblical perspective as seen here and in Romans 12:10; 1 Peter 5:5-6.

### **GROW IN THE WORD**

• How would you describe the relationship between unity and humility in these verses?

Paul called on the Philippians to reflect on the benefits of their union with Jesus and to pursue unity with one another. To follow through, the Philippians had to put off selfish ambition and put on humility.

• How have you seen selfish ambition, conceit, or self-centeredness cause division between people whether at home, in your workplaces, communities, or churches?

• In what ways do you want your attitude or perspective towards others to change in light of these verses?
