3. What does Ehud say to King Eglon to get him alone and away from all of his attendants?

Once they are alone in the roof chamber of Eglon’s summer palace, what does Ehud say to him (v.20)?

4. What happens next between Ehud and Eglon (vv. 21-23)?

Why don’t the servants initially check on their king (v. 24)?

What does this delay allow Ehud to do (v. 26)?

5. When Ehud arrives in Seirah, he “blows the trumpet in the hill country of Ephraim” to gather the Israelites together. What does Ehud say in regards to the Moabites (v. 28)?

How many Moabites are struck down?

How many are able to escape across the Jordan River?

6. How long does peace last (the longest period of rest during the time of the Judges)?

7. Who is the next to arise and deliver Israel? What do we know about him (Judges 3:31, 5:6)?

8. For believers in Christ, what spiritual weapons are within reach in our battle against the evil one and the temptations of this world?
