"Jephthah, an Unlikely Leader" Judges 10:17-11:33

1. At the end of last week's passage, the Israelites demonstrated genuine repentance by confessing their sins, putting away their foreign gods, and serving the Lord.

We then read in Judges 10:17 that Ammonites set up camp in Gilead and what do the people of Gilead say to one another in verse 18?

- 2. In verse 1 of chapter 11, we meet the ninth judge of Israel: Jephthah. What 3-4 things do we learn about him in verses 1 and 2?
- 3. What happens to Jephthah after he flees from his brothers? (vs. 3)

What causes the elders of Gilead to ask Jephthah to return? (vss. 5-11)

- 4. What question does Jephthah send messengers to ask the king of Ammon? (v. 12)
- 5. What reply do the messengers return with? (v. 13)
- 6. Jephthah sends messengers once again and this time with a history lesson (vss. 15-27) on how Israel came to possess the land of the Amorites after the Exodus. His argument is: the Lord had given this land to Israel. What does the king of Ammon do with the message? (v. 28)
- 7. What does the Lord place upon Jephthah in order to achieve victory?
- 8. What's the result of Jephthah's conflict with the sons of Ammon?
- 9. The presence of the Holy Spirit with Old Testament leaders was primarily for the purpose of accomplishing a service for God. What purpose does the abiding presence of Spirit have in our lives today as believers in Christ?
