CALLING "SHOTGUN"

PREPARE YOUR HEART & MIND

Begin this time in prayer, confessing any sins you can recall, thanking the Lord for the gift of His Word, and asking for His Spirit to guide you in your time.

32 Now they were on the road going up to Jerusalem, and Jesus was walking on ahead of them; and they were amazed, and those who followed were fearful. And again He took the twelve aside and began to tell them what was going to happen to Him, 33 saying, "Behold, we are going up to Jerusalem, and the Son of Man will be handed over to the chief priests and the scribes; and they will condemn Him to death and will hand Him over to the Gentiles. 34 And they will mock Him and spit on Him, and flog Him and kill Him; and three days later He will rise from the dead."

35 James and John, the two sons of Zebedee, came up to Jesus, saying to Him, "Teacher, we want You to do for us whatever we ask of You." 36 And He said to them, "What do you want Me to do for you?" 37 They said to Him, "Grant that we may sit, one on Your right and one on Your left, in Your glory." 38 But Jesus said to them, "You do not know what you are asking. Are you able to drink the cup that I drink, or to be baptized with the baptism with which I am baptized?" 39 They said to Him, "We are able." And Jesus said to them, "The cup that I drink you shall drink; and you shall be baptized with the baptism with which I am baptized. 40 But to sit on My right or on My left is not Mine to give; but it is for those for whom it has been prepared."

41 Hearing this, the other ten began to feel indignant with James and John. 42 Calling them to Himself, Jesus said to them, "You know that those who are recognized as rulers of the Gentiles domineer over them; and their people in high position exercise authority over them. 43 But it is not this way among you; rather, whoever wants to become prominent among you shall be your servant; 44 and whoever wants to be first among you shall be slave of all. 45 For even the Son of Man did not come to be served, but to serve, and to give His life as a ransom for many."





REFLECT/CONNECT

Use these questions for a time of individual reflection or to connect with others in meaningful conversation.

These questions are designed as a guide for individual study and to foster spiritual conversation with a group of people.

GROW IN THE WORD

- O1. On the way to Jerusalem, Jesus predicted his fate, telling his disciples about his impending suffering, death, and resurrection. James and John requested that they be given seats of authority and honor next to Jesus in his kingdom. Jesus questioned whether or not they were willing to share in his sufferings, and the two disciples affirmed that they were willing (v. 32-40).
 - What stands out to you about how the disciples responded to Jesus' prediction about his death? Compare Jesus' prediction and the disciples' responses here to the first two predictions of Jesus' death in Mark 8:31-33; 9:31-37.

GROW IN THE WORD

	How would you describe the mindset of James and John, and how does it relate to Jesus teaching on the road?
• '	What is the path to honor and authority according to Jesus' words in verses 38-40?
02.	The rest of the disciples were angered at James and John for their request. Jesus called them together and taught that true honor and authority came through humble service. Jesus declared the heart of his mission, to serve and to give his life as a ransom (v. 41-45).
	How does Jesus describe his purpose for coming to earth? Take note of Philippians 2:5-8; Hebrews 9:15.

GROUP DISCUSSION GUIDE

Pray to begin your group time. Remind the group why you are meeting: to connect in meaningful relationships, to grow spiritually, and to engage in the life and work of the church together. Reflect on the values you want to share as a group (i.e. confidentiality, authenticity, grace).



You can use these suggestions to foster connection and build community in your group. You can break your group into smaller parts if needed, pick a question to discuss, and let each member get to know one another.

- Spend a few minutes catching up with one another.
- Ask 1-2 questions from the Reflect/Connect section of the passage guide and give each person a chance to respond.



Gather back as a big group if you broke up earlier and have one person pray over your time discussing God's word. As you discuss, don't worry if there are questions left unanswered or unresolved. Reach out to ministry leaders or pastors for any needed clarification.

- Select 3-4 out of the first 5 questions to discuss. Pick questions that stand out to you, or that you believe would be most helpful for your group.
- Read any cross-references together and discuss.



Reflect on the biblical truth God revealed to you this week and discuss a plan of action to apply what you have learned. Gather in smaller groups of 2-4 again. Discuss your plan of action and pray for one another.

- Discuss the last two questions of the passage guide. Encourage your group to discuss ways to actively apply the passage.
- Close group time by sharing prayer requests and praying for one another.
