## 2 TIMOTHY 3:16

### Prepare Your Heart & Mind

Begin this time in prayer, confessing any sins you can recall, thanking the Lord for the gift of His Word, and asking for His Spirit to guide you in your time.



### Reflect/Connect

- Use these questions for a time of individual reflection or to connect with others in meaningful conversation.

### Grow in the Word

- These questions are designed as a guide for individual study and to foster spiritual conversation with a group of people.

## REFLECT/CONNECT

- In what ways have you made "the most of your time" over the last two weeks?
- How would you describe or defend your view of the trustworthiness and reliability of the Bible?
- How equipped do you feel you are to defend your view of the Bible?

## GROW IN THE WORD

Paul emphasized the importance of the Scriptures to Timothy, for Timothy's present and future ministry.

- What does Paul mean by the phrase "all Scripture is inspired by God"? Compare translations of verse 16 and see also 2 Tim. 3:15; 2 Peter 1:20-21; 2 Thess. 2:13.
- What is the significance of this meaning?
- How does it impact, affirm, or challenge your view of the Scriptures?

Paul proclaimed that the very source of the original Biblical writings was God himself working through human authors and their unique personalities.


- How should or how does this view of Scripture change your perspective on life?
- How does this teaching help you to stand firm in your faith?
- What does it practically look like for the Bible to be useful for teaching, reproof, correction, and training in righteousness?

## ENGAGE WITH THE WORLD

One way God calls us to engage with the world is to be prepared to give an answer to anyone who asks about the hope that's in us. Since the knowledge of our hope comes from Scripture, we must be prepared to give an answer for our trust in its reliability.

- What are your reasons for trusting that what the Bible says about Jesus is true?

- How would you communicate these reasons to a non-Christian?
