

GROW IN THE WORD

Moses provided historical and cultural background for a central character in the history of our faith: Abram, who would later be called Abraham. We are introduced to Abram and his wife Sarai soon after they settled in Haran (11:27-32).

• What do you learn about Abram and our shared, common humanity? Specifically, what hardships are implied within the genealogy given in these verses?

• What do you notice about how Moses described Sarai, and why is it significant? See Genesis 12:7, 18:10-14.

God commanded Abram to take a large step of faith when he called him to leave his native country, his culture, his community, and to go to an unknown land. God promised tremendous blessings to Abram, blessings that would lay the foundation of God's work to redeem the world (12:1-3).

- What did Abram do to merit selection for such a high calling and blessing? See Joshua 24:2-3
 and the note below from The New Unger's Bible Dictionary about the city of Ur.
 - "As a result of archaeological excavation, the city of Ur is now one of the best-known sites of southern Babylonia. Woolley in his Abraham: Recent Discoveries and Hebrew Origins . . . gives a description of the worship of the city god of Ur, the moon god Nannar and his consort Ningal. Woolley describes in minute detail the sacred temenos of the city in which were the famous ziggurat and the various buildings erected to the moon god and his consort, with a description of the moon god ritual." •	How would you summarize what God promised Abram?
•	Compare Genesis 11:31 with Acts 7:2-4. How would you describe Abram's initial response to God's call?
