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GROW IN THE WORD

- O1. Moses encountered God through a burning bush that miraculously remained unconsumed by the fire. Speaking through the bush, God revealed his holiness and his identity as the God of Moses' ancestors: Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob. God expressed deep concern for the suffering of his people and commissioned Moses to rescue them out of Egypt. Moses was reluctant to obey, but God assured Moses with a promise of his presence and a description of his character (Exodus 3:1-15).
 - What does God's chosen name reveal to you about his character and his nature? See also Psalm 90:1-2; Isaiah 43:10-11; Hebrews 13:8.
 - How does Moses' response to God mirror the ways in which we struggle and doubt when God calls us to carry out his purposes? Take note of the content and frequency of Moses' questions to God.

• In what ways can God's promise to be with Moses encourage you when you face similar doubts and questions as you seek to obey? See Jeremiah 1:4-10; Matthew 28:29; Hebrews 13:5-6.

- **02.** The Jewish religious leaders accused Jesus of being demon-possessed in response to his teaching about death, God, and Abraham. They confronted Jesus and questioned his authority to make such claims about truth and eternal life. Jesus responded by proclaiming his knowledge of God and his own eternal nature, which resulted in an attempted at murder by the religious leaders (John 8:52-59).
 - In what way does Jesus' teaching and proclamation of his identity relate to Exodus 3:1-15? In other words, who does Jesus say he is?

• How would you describe the religious leaders' posture toward Jesus and his teaching? See Hebrews 3:12-13.

• In light of who Jesus says he is, how do you want your posture towards him and his teaching to change?


